OUR VOLUNTEERS

The work of the SWC would not be possible without the continued support and engagement from our wonderful volunteers. CONFERENCES

Over the year we have hosted multiple conferences on a range of subjects. These areas of interest were selected to align with the wants of women in Scotland, with a focus on direct impact and lived experience.

What Should Childcare Look Like in Scotland?

In February 2024, we hosted a conference focusing on women's experiences of childcare in Scotland, where women heard from expert speakers. We hoped that this event would unveil new strategies to improve childcare provision across the country, with women stating that they wanted increased availability and reduced costs. "Always great information, and very good speakers."

How Can We Make Transport Work for Women in Scotland?

Poor transport has been raised as a considerable barrier to women's societal participation. To understand this issue in more detail, we held a conference in May, which asked attendees to consider what they would like to see change with regards to Scottish transport infrastructure. Those who attended explained that they would like reduced transport costs and improved accessibility.

Women's Mental Health: Improving Experiences in Scotland

Women's mental health has continued to worsen in recent years, with isolation and anxiety levels increasing. The SWC carried out a conference which aimed to understand this growing issue, as well as what women would like to see change across mental healthcare provision in Scotland. Key themes arose as a result of discussions, such as the need for community resources and third sector funding.

Impact of Poverty on Women

We know that women are disproportionately impacted by poverty in Scotland. As a result, the SWC carried out a project which aimed to encapsulate the impact of poverty on women. The project included a conference event, where attendees heard from expert speakers and took part in roundtable activities focusing on child poverty, food insecurity and health inequalities.
