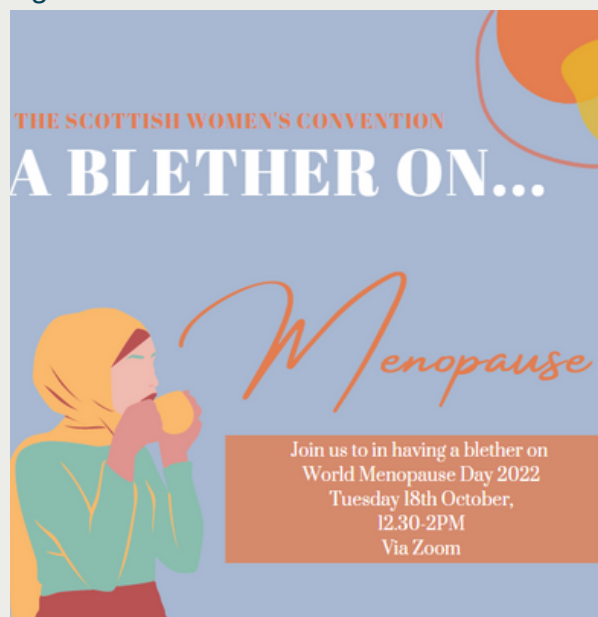
Scottish Women's Convention Monthly Newsletter
